High School Completion Programs



New Britain Adult Education Center offers two **FREE** programs to earn a high school diploma. You will find more detailed information on our website www.csdnb.org/schools/adulted or by calling **860-229-6106**. Guidance counselors are available to help you choose the program that's best for you!

National External Diploma Program (NEDP)

The NEDP is a national, competency-based high school completion program geared toward adults who have extensive life experiences. It is ideal for those who cannot attend regularly scheduled classes due to job, family or other responsibilities. NEDP offers credit for work and life achievements, confidentiality, flexible hours and demonstration of knowledge and skills through real-life activities. NEDP candidates will demonstrate high school level abilities through a series of assessment tasks completed at home and during one-on-one meetings arranged at a convenient time with a trained NEDP assessor.

CT Virtual High School

The Connecticut Adult Virtual High School program provides students enrolled in at least 2 classes in the New Britain Adult High School Credit Diploma program the option of earning up to 7.0 credits online.

Courses Include: America at War, Geometry, Chemistry, American Government/Civics, Algebra, Contemporary Literature, Modern Literature, Transitions, Contemporary Issues, Biology, Financial Literacy and Life Management.



Adult High School Credit Diploma Program (AHSCDP)

The AHSCDP Program is a way for students who withdraw from school to complete their high school education, by earning credits for specific core and elective courses. At the time of registration, students must present a signed parent withdrawal form (17 year old only), immunization records and an official transcript.

Beginning January, 2017 graduation requirements are as follows:

23 credits needed: 4 English, 3 Mathematics (1 in Algebra & 1 in Geometry required), 3 Social Studies (1 American History & 1 Civics required) 3 Science, 2 Vocational Ed/Arts (1/2 credit Career Pathways, 1/2 credit in Health & 1 credit in Computer Applications required) and 8 Electives.

Credits may be transferred from previous high schools however, a minimum of 2 credits must be completed at New Britain Adult Education. Along with traditional classes, students may also earn credits through, online classes (CT Virtual High School), community service and work experience.

- You must be at least 17 years old

English As a Second Language (ESL)

- Would you like to improve your English communication at home and on the job?
- Would you like to improve your reading and writing skills?

ESL classes are designed to help adults improve their English skills in listening, reading, and writing. Classes are offered for English Language Learners based upon the students speaking, reading and writing skills. Upon entering, students will take a listening and reading test to determine classroom placement. Classes are scheduled mornings at the Adult Education Center, Jefferson Elementary School, and the YWCA. Evening classes are held at New Britain High School.

Adult Basic Education (ABE)

Adult Basic Education (ABE) classes are offered to assist students in improving reading, writing, and mathematical skills. These classes are designed to support students who wish to improve their basic skills for employment and/or prepare for entry into the GED classes, Credit Diploma Program or NEDP.

General Education Development (GED)

The General Education Development (GED) program focuses on the development of reading, writing, mathematics, science, social studies, and technology skills in preparation for the GED exam. Students enrolled in the GED program can take periodic practice tests to assess their progress and readiness to take the GED exam. The exam is offered at various sites throughout the state. The **New Britain Adult Education Center is a registration site only**. Citizenship
